

Solutions for Election Security

The lack of accuracy, transparency and accountability in the current Texas election process means it would be impossible to present sufficient evidence in a court of law to prove that anyone elected to public office was the true intent of the majority of those who voted in their election.

The current Texas election process is a true “BLACK-BOX” operation. Why? Because there is no TRANSPARENCY, no ACCOUNTABILITY and the ACCURACY is unknowable. There are only three things we know for sure at the conclusion of a Texas election:

1. Some unknown number of people cast votes;
2. The voting period began and ended, and
3. Winners were declared by a governing body.

Texans around the State are working with State legislators to create a new system of voting.

The proposed system seeks to minimize the opportunities for election mismanagement and manipulation, by requiring:

- hand-marked, sequentially numbered ballots preprinted on counterfeit-resistant paper
- paper poll books, fixed before the election period
- precinct “neighborhood” level voting (no county-wide centers)
- tabulation of all ballots by hand, in the precincts, on election night
- verifying vote results with hand counts and robust audits
- elimination of the gap between election day and early voting
- limiting mail-in voting to only those who legitimately need it
- cleaning up and securing our voter rolls, (only qualified and eligible citizens on our rolls)
- restore felony penalties for fraudulent voting
- reinstate the Texas Attorney General’s prosecutorial authority to investigate and prosecute election fraud and voter fraud prohibit rank choice voting
